Celebrate a Season of Picture Books!



Autumn is here! Get ready to celebrate the best picture books of the season by hosting a Fall Story Hour event in your store or library. Here's everything you need to help make your event a hit.

Event Planning Tips

Two to Three Weeks Ahead:

- Pick a date and time for your event. (Remember, younger children have shorter attention spans and get tired more easily. We suggest your party last no more than an hour.)
- Advertise the event in your store newsletter and on your website.
- Create a Fall Story Hour window display to promote your event.

One Week Ahead:

- Post a sign announcing your event next to the register or in your window.
- Photocopy a supply of the coloring and activity sheets (**Reproducible A L**) and the answer key (Reproducible M) included in this guide.
- Collect plenty of pencils, crayons, and craft supplies.
- Make arrangements to have extra help available to ensure that your event runs smoothly.

Event Day:

- Decorate your event space.
- Be sure necessary materials are in place.
- Have a supply of the sticker sheets available to hand out to guests.

Fall for These Event Ideas!

To set the scene, decorate with colorful fall leaves (or make your own out of construction paper) and paper cutouts of apples and pumpkins. If you plan to host your event near one of the fall holidays like Halloween or Thanksgiving, consider decorating with jack-o-lanterns, spider webs, and handprint turkey art. Guests can come dressed in fall colors, Halloween costumes, or as one of their favorite picture book characters, such as a dinosaur from the How Do Dinosaurs books or Clifford the Big Red Dog.

For refreshments, think of seasonal treats like warm cider, pumpkin punch, apple and pear slices, candy corn, and gingerbread.

And no party is complete without giveaways, so your kit comes packed with sticker sheets. Pass them out during activity time or after your event to thank everyone for coming.

Fun and Games

Set up an area in your event space for activity time. Be sure to have enough craft supplies and copies of the included reproducible activities and coloring sheets for everyone present.

If your event is Halloween-themed, consider playing kid-favorite songs like "Monster Mash." For autumn events, sing fall-themed versions of popular children's tunes like:
